The Princeton Public Library will be offering a **new database, Hoopla, on March 5th.** for our **Patoka Township resident cardholders** and **subscription cardholders.**

You will be able to borrow eBooks, audio books, movies, TV episodes, and musical albums. You can download or stream these items to your tablet, phone, computer or TV. You can even download to your Apple Fire or Roku device. We are limiting your downloads to four(4) per month at the present time. There is no waiting if you see the item you can download or stream it. There is no waiting for a person to finish with the item before you can check it out. There are fixed borrowing times: videos for three (3) days, music for seven (7) days, and books for twenty-one (21) days. To use this service you need to go to the library's homepage (www.princetonpl.lib.in.us) and click on the HOOPLA icon on the left hand side of the page. You will need to put in your e-mail address (2 times), password (2 times), select your library from the list (Princeton) and put in your library card number to register. You will only need to do this the first time when you register. The next time you only need to login. If you find more than four items a month that you wish to download, you can save them to your list on Hoopla and download them the next month. Each month you receive four (4) downloads. If you did not use all four the previous month, it does not get added to the next month's total. If you have problems with using this database, please ask the staff for assistance. Please let the staff or library board members know what you think of this service.

The library has added the following magazines: *Food network, 4-wheel and off road, Pro wrestling, Rachel Ray everyday, and UTV action* for a total of 39 general magazines. We also subscribe to the following newspapers: *Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Evansville Courier and Press, Princeton Daily Clarion, South Gibson Star-Times, and Press Dispatch.*

The library board kept the subscription card fee the same as last year, \$50.00.

Our patrons checked out 59,772 items from the library, on-line circulation (e-books, audio, music) was 11,404. The library presented 382 programs at the library with 3,906 people attending. We presented 169 programs outside of the library with 5,282 people attending.
